## Nanny's secrets for success

A FORMER namey who started her own agency with money she saved from her wages is about to

Celebrate 20 years in business.

Debbie Elliff, 45, of Woodville Road, Thornton
Heath, has prospered with her Little Masters and
Misses agency, despite the passing of the Mary
Poppins era.

Debbie, who began her working life as a namy

Debbie, who began her working the as a namy in central Leoden, made up her mind to open her own agency at an early stage.

She said: "I spotted a gap in the market. I was living in Broadstains at the time and I couldn't find an agency anywhere in Kent or the London suburbs, so I decided to open my own. But I had no experience of business and I hadn't taken account of the essential expenses involved.

"My initial set-back didn't put me off. I just took extra lobe, more namying or even cleaning.

extra jobs - more namying or even cleaning -working seven days a week to raise my initial

investment.

"I finally opened my agency in 1985 here in Thornton Hesth, and in the early days I did most of my advertising for nannies and clients in the Croydon Advertiser.

"But as the childrane market changed it became necessary to seek clients in more specialist publications—buby magazines and the like. "Now I rely or word-of-most hor my nanness. have about 500 m my books and each of them comes back to me looking for another job about every two of three years."

Debbie charges a one-off payment of up to 2700

Debbie charges a one-off payment of up to \$700 for finding and placing a numy successfully and

the namey can expect to earn up to £70 a day for an average ten hours work.

Today the nature of the job has changed and the

places where nannies work are also very differ-

Debbie said: "Nanny will still take the children Debbie said: "Anany will sake the children out but it tends to be to play-groups rather than for walks in the park. And she will speed the rest of her time working directly with her charges rather than doing domestic chores."

The home situations have changed in the past 20 years too. According to Debbie there are fur fewer grand houses employing mannies. These days the ields rich are likely to engage an ou pair, while a concernable work in more modest sur-

while a nanny will work in more modest surroundings.

She said: "I place up to half my namies in what

I would call ordinary homes - semi-detached or terraced houses - where one parent works full-time and one works part-time.

ime and one works part-time.

"The couple need a namy for the two or three days when they are both out, or one of them is working at home, but doesn't want to be disturbed."

Debbie is increusingly placing nannies who are nothers themselves, with their own child on hand as part of the deal.

as part of the deal.

She said: "The attraction for an employer is that this is a more economic way of buying a namy's services. She will work for less pay but, in my experience, the standard of care is unaffect-

Despite a lifetime upon looking after other peo-ple's children, Debbie has none of her own.

She said: "It was seenething I always intended to do, but I have devoted myself single-mindedly to my business and I think the time has now

LIVE Aid and the first episode of EastEnders were among the events of 1985, as was the launch in Croydon by Deborah Elliff of Little Masters and Misses, a nanny agency which celebrates its 15th anniversary this month.

Miss Elliff, a former nanny herself, initially ran the agency from rented premises before buying the shop it now occupies in Woodville Road. Thornton Heath in 1987. Now she has around 800 families and 600 nannies and baby-sitters on her books and places, on average, some 250 per month.

Hers was the first agency to introduce regular morning sessions in which the likes of the British Red Cross Society and Croydon Council's health department offer nannies a series of updates on first aid and other matters relevant to child care.

Running a nanny agency is great fun but very hard work according to Miss Elliff, who has been reflecting on the past 15 years.

She said: "I was determined from day one not to lose sight of the fact that this business is primarily about providing care for children.

"I believe it is vital that nannies are able to keep themselves up to date with current thinking on this complex subject.

"Things move quickly, so the more information I can make available to the nannies, the better the standard of care the children will receive. "I am now looking forward to the

"I am now looking forward to the agency's next 15 years."

- LM&M was the first agency to introduce its own First Aid course for nannies & babysitters.
   Also daytime talks by Doctors on Meningitis symptoms & by the British Red Cross on First Aid.
- The agency produces regular newsletters and fact sheets to keep nannies, babysitters and clients informed of industry and agency developments.

Deborah added: "Any parent that has ever complained that their children have a better social life than them could benefit from a subscription to our babysitting service."
